1) AI Hameli Has Perfect Day To Win F1 H2O, Torrente stars to 4th In Qatar



DOHA - Ahmed Al Hameli battled Sami Selio at the race start, passed him on the first turn and went on to control the race and win for the first time in Doha taking the opening Grand Prix of the 2012 UIM F1 H2O World Championship for power boating in front of thousands of race fans along the corniche in Doha, Qatar on Saturday.

American driver Shaun Torrente put on a great show for thousands of racing fans in the UIM F1 H2O World Championship season opener in Doha, Qatar. The Miami driver steered his Qatar Team DAC boat from 18th position at the start to fourth place, less than five seconds behind race

winner Ahmed Al Hameli of Team Abu Dhabi.

Qatar Team's Shaun Torrente raced his way from last to fourth place in the UIM F1 H2O World Championship opener. Al-Hameli led from start to finish despite multiple yellow flag stoppages to begin the 2012 season with the maximum amount of points. The young Team Abu Dhabi driver was pushed by the two-time world champion, Sam Selio from the Mad Croc Team, for 39 of the 40 laps and went on to win by 2.63 seconds for his sixth career victory.

Meanwhile, Selio didn't get the luck he needed, finishing third after being in second for all but the final lap when he was passed by French driver Philippe Chiappe of the CTIC China Team, who jumped from fourth to second to pick up 15 well-earned points.

After suffering technical problems on Friday, Torrente failed to set a qualifying time and was forced to start the race from the back of the field. After a stunning surge, Torrente was sitting in third with less than five laps to go until a yellow flag came out forcing a third restart. On the restart, Chiappe made a great move to pass Torrente, who was on the verge of reaching his first career podium.

Torrente's teammate Alex Carella, who had qualified second on Friday, started back in the 16th position after his engine let go in Saturday's morning warm-up, forcing an engine change and moving him almost to the tail end of the field. The defending world champion worked his way toward the front, taking fifth for his third straight top five performance in Doha.

The 2012 UIM F1 H2O World Championship now heads for Kazan in the Republic of Tatarstan in Russia for the second straight year on the weekend June 23-24.

2) P1 SuperStock USA Championship series dates announced



Powerboat P1 SuperStock USA Championship 2012 series kicks off in Florida at the end of March. The series is set for a second season of exciting and highly competitive offshore powerboat racing with five events on its race schedule.

For the second consecutive year, P1 SuperStock USA teams will race in Detroit, MI and Morehead City, NC with the addition of three new venues: St. Cloud, FL, Biloxi, MS and Pittsburgh, PA.

The season starts on March 30 - April 1 in St. Cloud, FL at 'Spring Fling'

presented by the Rotary Club of St. Cloud. This kick-off event will bring powerboat racing back to St. Cloud for the first time in three years. St. Cloud was traditionally the season opener for APBA offshore powerboat racing starting in 1983 when teams would race East Lake Toho as an exhibition race at the beginning of each season. The second event of the season is scheduled for April 26 - 29 in Biloxi, MS for 'Smokin' the Sound.' P1 SuperStock USA joined the Offshore Super Series for 'Smokin the Sound' in 2011 as an exhibition race but this year's race will count towards teams' overall championship score.

Look for P1 SuperStock USA at the Miami International Boat Show where the P1-28SS Panther will be on display at the Marriot Biscayne Bay Hotel and Marina. Demo rides will be available for potential customers with serious interest in the boat.

After 17 years of commitment to this sport, I have had a lot of wonderful experiences in powerboat racing. I am very grateful for my involvement and especially lucky to have been introduced to boat racing at such a young age. It is an incredible feeling, floating a tunnel boat on top of the water one second then turning tight in the corner the next, however, this is nothing compared to the feeling you get

surrounded by the people involved with this sport, "the racing family". My personal powerboat racing experience started with my father, Fred Wolf. My father worked at Mercury Marine and on weekends we were lucky enough to be able to accompany him to the races in the Mercury truck. My father and countless other Mercury employees spent hours supporting the powerboat racing community. He dedicated his time to growing and promoting the sport. Our non-racing weekends were spent up at our family cottage with racing legends Oley Berkis, Ted Gryguc, and Mark Rotharmel. I remember my dad spending hours with these athletes helping them.



This year (May 26-28, 2012) I am honored to be the first Canadian, as well as the first North American Woman competing at the historic 48th annual 24 Heures Motonautiques de Rouen (24 Hours of Rouen). Some say it's the roughest and most challenging tunnel boat race in the world with 24 hours of competition and drivers changes every two hours. Just to finish at this event is a testament to the team, driver and equipment. I am overwhelmed and incredibly appreciative of the support from the racing community. On a weekly basis I receive personal messages and phone calls of encouragement. In racing the focus generally is on the driver but from my perspective the driver is only a very small part of a huge picture. Powerboat racing, at least from my viewpoint is about the racing family, a family that supports each other. A driver will not be successful; no matter how talented they are, unless they have a strong support system.

I am incredible thankful for my support system, "a racing family", that has surrounded and provided a foundation for both teams in Rouen and in North America. This includes our incredible sponsors that trust us to represent their name and company. Thank you to the

race drivers, crews, supports and our fantastic sponsors. The fabulous Peter's and May family, APBA Historical Society, Motul, Teamtech Motorsports, Digatron USA, Mercury Marine – Canada and of course my husband, Mark and crew chief, Sam Haraway.




